Be Predictable


- Use sidewalks when available

FIRE PREVENTION MONTH AT THE CITY OF KINSTON

October was #FireSafetyMonth at Fire Station 1! Captain Barss and the Fire Department team hosted over 860 Lenoir County Elementary Pre-K, Kindergarten and First Graders from almost every school in the county. Students went through 10 safety stations including touching fire trucks, seeing a fire hose in action, a puppet show, the Fire Safety bounce house, and, of course, Stop, Drop, and Roll!

Special thanks to all our teachers, volunteers and firefighters who made this possible.

This holiday season, keep Fire Safety in mind with the following tips:

- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from your furnace, fireplace, or space heaters!
- Turn off all light strings and lit decorations before leaving home or going to bed!
- More than 1/3 of home decoration fires are started by candles--put them out before you leave the room!
- Test your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms once a year!

CITY COUNCIL UPDATES

The following are some highlights of the City Council meetings from -Sept-Nov 2021 (see the full minutes at kinstonnc.gov/AgendaCenter):

- Honored the 20th anniversary of 9/11
- Changed the development ordinance to allow buildings of any height in the B-1 zoning district to match other commercial zonings in the City
- Approved the Recreation Fee Assistance Program to help low income families afford to participate in Rec sports
- Heard Keegan Huynh, the newest Lead for North Carolina Fellow, present his plan for updating the American Disabilities Act Plan (ADA) for City facilities
- Celebrated Public Power Week and Customer Service Week in Public Services
- Celebrated Fire Prevention Month in October
- The City Council conveyed the property of the former shirt factory site on King Street to the Kinston Community Health Center (provided they meet certain goals for financing and construction) to invest \$10 million into a new healthcare center
- Re-expanded the Bird Scooter operation radius to include neighborhoods outside downtown
