SUMMER ENERGY SAVING TIPS

The first day of Summer is June 21st!

- Run ceiling fans counterclockwise. Mild air movement of 1MPH can make you feel 3 to 4 degrees cooler.
- Make sure furniture or drapes do not block your registers for supply & return air.
- Keep the sun out of your house. Close shades, blinds or curtains during the hottest part of the day.
- Replace incandescent bulbs with energy-efficient light-emitting diode (LED) bulbs.
- *Grill outdoors.* Using your electric oven and stovetop creates a lot of indoor heat.
- Do chores such as cleaning, cooking & laundry during the cooler early morning & evening hours to avoid home heat buildup.

The following are some highlights of the City Council meetings from March 2023 – May 2023

(see the full minutes at kinstonnc.gov/AgendaCenter):

- The engineering agreement with Booth & Associates for the Vernon Avenue Pole Replacements - 115kV Transmission Line Project was approved.
- Mayor Pro Tem Hardy recognized the City Clerk and Deputy City Clerk of the City of Kinston in honor of the 54th Annual Professional Municipal Clerks Week.
- Resolution for Membership of the American Flood Coalition was adopted.
- AKC Reunite Adopt a K-9 Grant was accepted by Council.
- The proposal to increase Parking Fines city-wide from \$2.00 to \$25.00 was approved unanimously by Council.
- The Council approved a motion for a Trash Trout to be installed in the Adkin Branch tributary of the Neuse. This is a passive litter tray installed on small creeks to capture trash.
