## G.R.E.A.T.

The Kinston Police Department's School Resource Officer Rouse started teaching 2024's first G.R.E.A.T at Rochelle Middle School in January. Over 20 children signed up for this program and were excited for the first day. Major Jenkins, Sgt. Moody, and Sgt. Biggins were in attendance for the introduction to the program.

### What is G.R.E.A.T?

Gang Resistance Education And Training (G.R.E.A.T.) is an evidence-based and effective gang and violence prevention program built around school-based, law enforcement officer-instructed classroom curricula. The Program is intended as an immunization against delinquency, youth violence, and gang membership for children in the years immediately before the prime ages for introduction into gangs and delinquent behavior.



## KINSTON 101 UPDATE



The Planning Department started the year off with our first cohort of Kinston 101 after a few years on hiatus. The group includes eight individuals who come out every Wednesday at 6pm to learn more about the City of Kinston and the departments that keep it afloat. Our first session introduced them to the concept of local government and provided information needed to build upon during the remainder of the program. We've since heard from HR, MIS, Police, and Fire. After each session we send out an evaluation to gauge how the program is being received. Each evaluation has come back with rave reviews and comments expressing their contentment in being a part of Kinston 101. Our upcoming sessions include Public Services, Planning, and Parks & Rec. We'll close out the program on April 2nd's City Council Meeting with a brief graduation ceremony.


## CITY COUNCIL UPDATES

The following are some highlights of the City Council meetings from December 2023 – February 2024 (see the full minutes at [kinstonnc.gov/AgendaCenter](http://kinstonnc.gov/AgendaCenter)):

- The City recognized 3 retirees from the City. Battalion Chief Scrfuri served for 28.5 years. Danny Daughety started his career with the LCSO in 2002 & transitioned to KPD in 2016. Blaine Hargett retired from Parks & Recreation with 30 years of service. Thank you for your years of service and dedication to the City!
- Following the presentation of certified election results from the Lenoir County Board of Elections, Mayor Hardy presented a plaque to Councilmember Sammy C. Aiken for his 12 years of service on the City Council and to the City of Kinston.
- The Resolution to accept the \$2 million grant from the NC Land & Water Fund for construction of the Adkin Branch Flood Mitigation Project was approved.
- Keith Goyette, Police Chief presented the 2023 Kinston Police Annual Report. The 52-page report is available at [KPD.org](http://KPD.org), along with the 2020, 2021, and 2022 reports. Chief Goyette shared the violent crime reduction of 65% of people shot, a 55% reduction in shootings, a 60% reduction in murders, and a 233% increase in Federal indictments in comparison to 2022.
- The Planning Department conducted three input sessions involving citizens' input concerning their take on a social district in Kinston. Elizabeth Blount, Planning Director, and NC Fellow Brittany Best shared information regarding the input sessions. Council made the motion to begin the process of establishing a social district and stakeholders involved.
